THE MARYLAND SCHOOL for the BLIND (MSB) Summer Program July 2012

One week program offerings with morning and afternoon sessions focusing on two areas of the *Expanded Core Curriculum for Blind and Visually Impaired Children and Youths (ECC)*

INTEGRATING LOW VISION DEVICES AND TECHNOLOGY INTO DAY TO DAY LIFE

Students will learn the use of vision enhancement devices through use of the Envision curriculum (developed by The American Printing House for the Blind) and/or will be introduced to the use of computer (including the Apple iPad.) and assistive technology that promote ease of access to written and auditory material. Technology will be integrated with literacy and math activities as well as activities of daily living such as reading street signs, reading food labels, identifying colors and money. The program will be staffed by experienced Teachers of the Visually Impaired, Orientation and Mobility Instructors, and a Low Vision Specialist.

ADAPTED RECREATION AND LEISURE

Students will be introduced to a variety of accessible recreational and leisure activities including team and individual sports. The program will be staffed by an Adapted Physical Education teacher with training and experience in working with the visually impaired population.
